## A Word from our President Emeritus

Dear Friends,

This week I heard a beautiful choir sing *O Holy Night, O night divine*. Truly it was the most awe-inspiring night when God became a helpless baby to reveal His love for us. Then this week I was reading 1 Timothy 4:8 where Paul tells young Timothy *For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come*. We usually think of *godliness* as doing godly things. So I researched the word more closely and found that its root meaning is to stand back from something out of fear or

awe with a prefix expressing abundance.
